As one year ends, another begins, but does anything change? What makes one day different from another? Is the 1st January going to be substantially different from the 31st of December? Maybe yes, and perhaps no. What is certain, however, is the date changes nothing. There is a chorus from the 1970s that I learned in Youth for Christ too long ago; a song that has haunted me all my Christian years. The chorus line goes, "This is the day that the Lord has made, we will rejoice and be glad in it". It's a verse from one of my favourite psalms, Psalm 118:24. For reasons I still don't understand why those particular words have fixed themselves in my mind. They are so ingrained that if I'm testing out a pen, or doodling for no specific reason; those are the words I write, and they came to me again while thinking what to write this morning. Dates don't change a life, events do. Events happen in moments of time, and how we view those events changes the way we experience them. Its the same with God. God isn't out there waiting for us to turn up on a specific date or time, God is here, now. God is with us at the turn of each minute, hour, day, week, year, millenni-

um. So, if this is the moment that the Lord has made, what might the moment be like, if we choose to rejoice in it. How might the days colour change, how will the events of the day seem different if we step aside from hopes and expectations and see that God is present despite the outcomes? Read Psalm 118 and enjoy each day of this Christmas and new year season.
